Paper Maple Key Seed

Many plants have seeds that move to new sprouting spots by wind including maple trees. Use these instructions to create a model of a maple key to discover how it flies.

Location: Anywhere

Recommended Ages: 8+


Materials:

Paper helicopter seed template

- Scissors
- Paper clip

Activity:

- 1. Cut out one of the four templates.
- 2. Cut the solid lines only.
- 3. Fold section C along dotted lines over section E
- 4. Fold section D along dotted lines over section C/E.
- 5. Fold section A along dotted line towards you.
- 6. Fold section B along dotted line away from you.
- 7. Fold the edge of section C/D/E towards you.
- 8. Hold to that together with a paper clip.
- 9. To launch your maple key seed (helicopter), throw it up and away from you.





STEM Extension:

Here are some challenges and questions for you to tackle through experimentation.

- 1. Can you make it stay up in the air longer?
- 2. Can you make it rotate faster or slower?
- 3. How does it change if you make it smaller or larger?
- 4. How does it change if you make it with different paper?
- 5. What would happen if you changed the weight at the bottom, that is, replaced the paper clip with something else?
